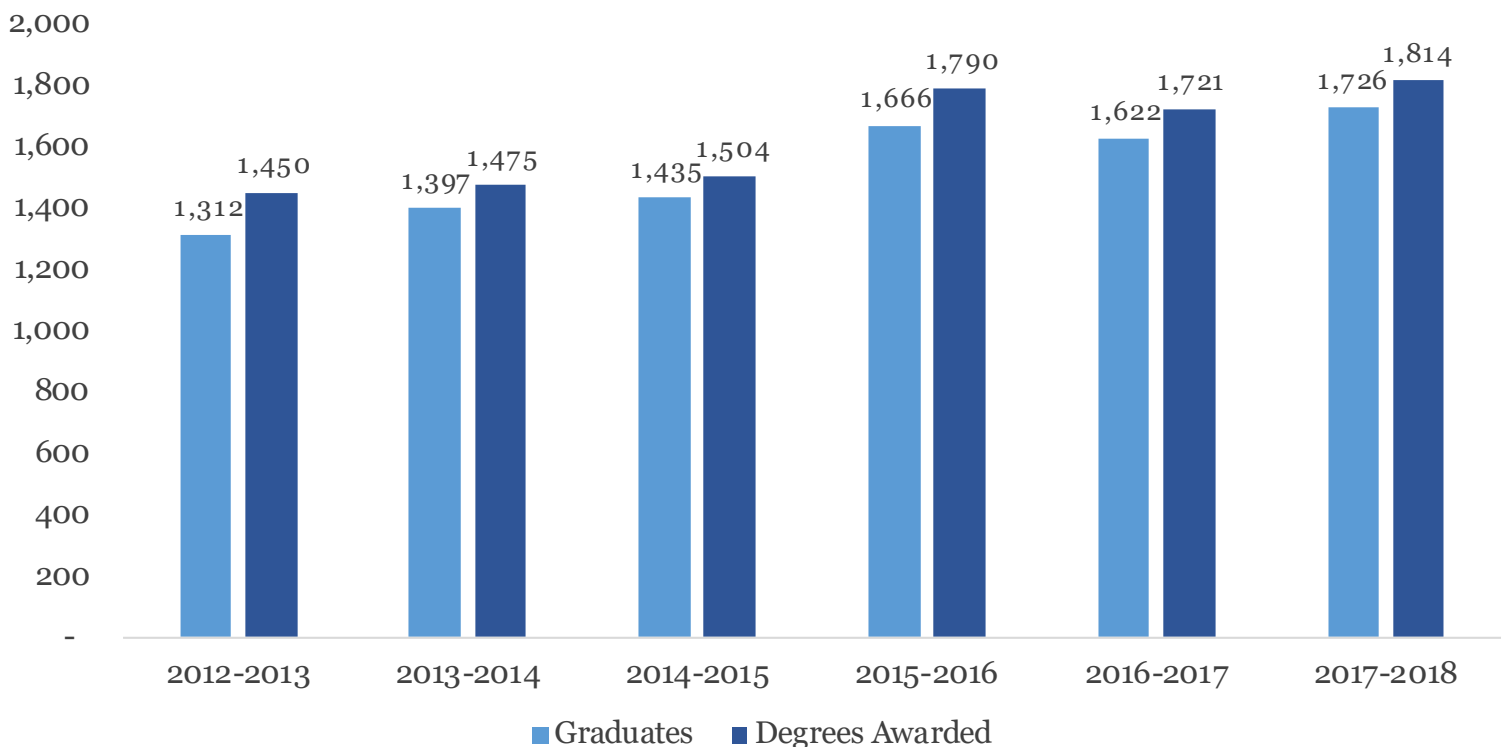

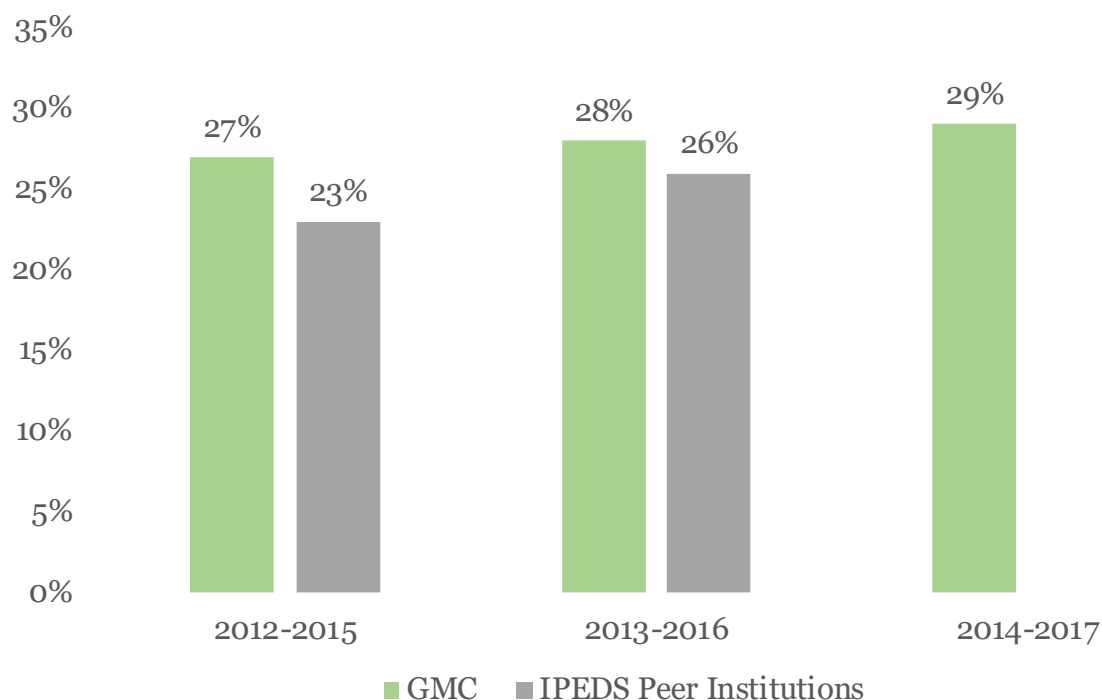

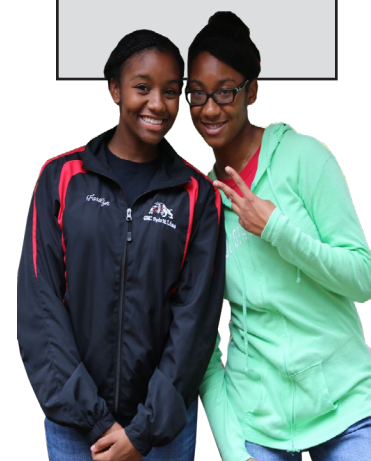
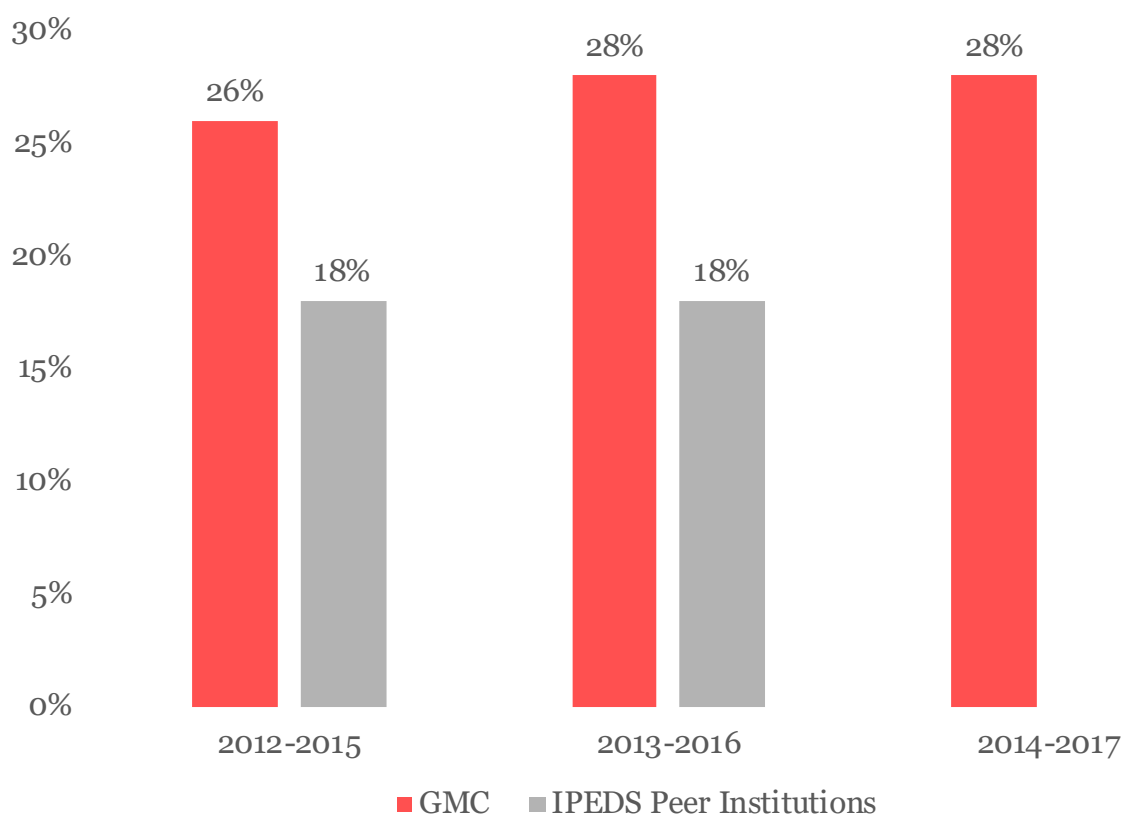
Graduation Rate - Three Year (150%) First-Time, Full-Time Students



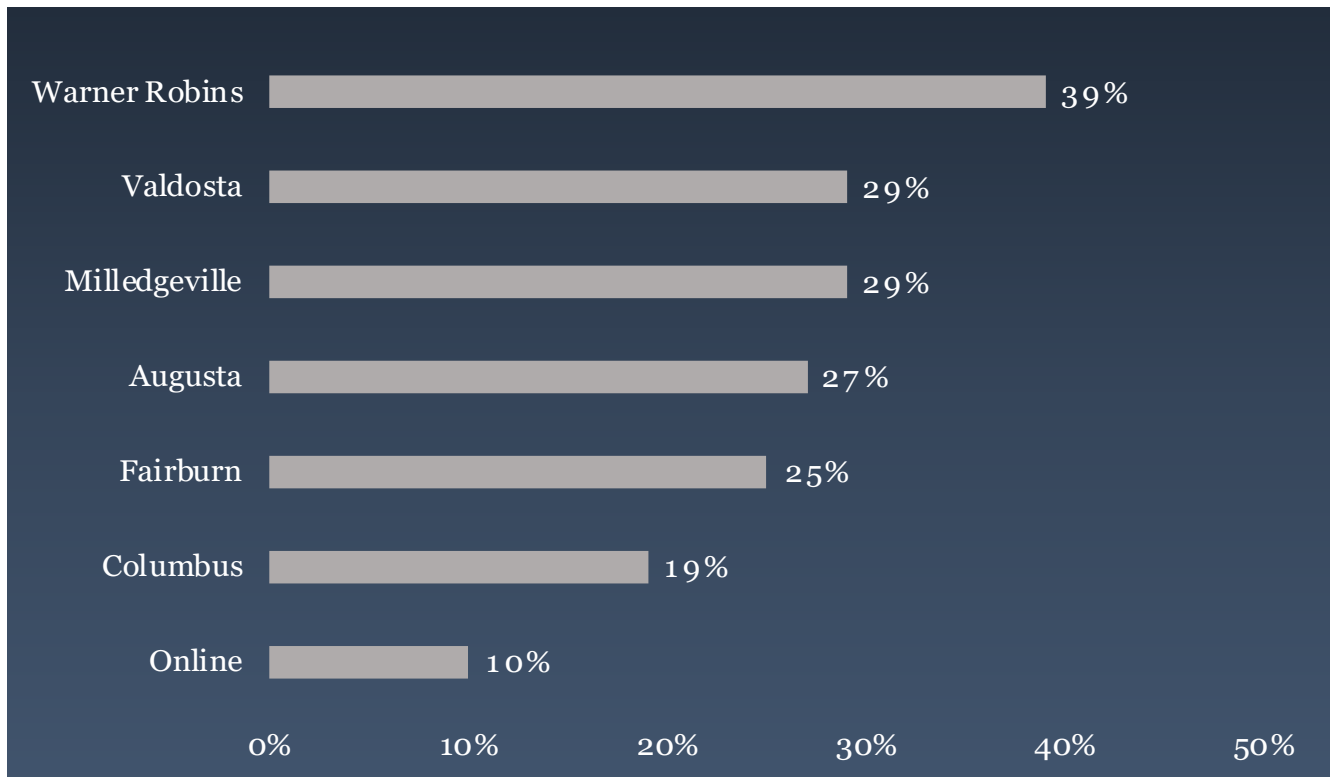
Graduate and then Transfer

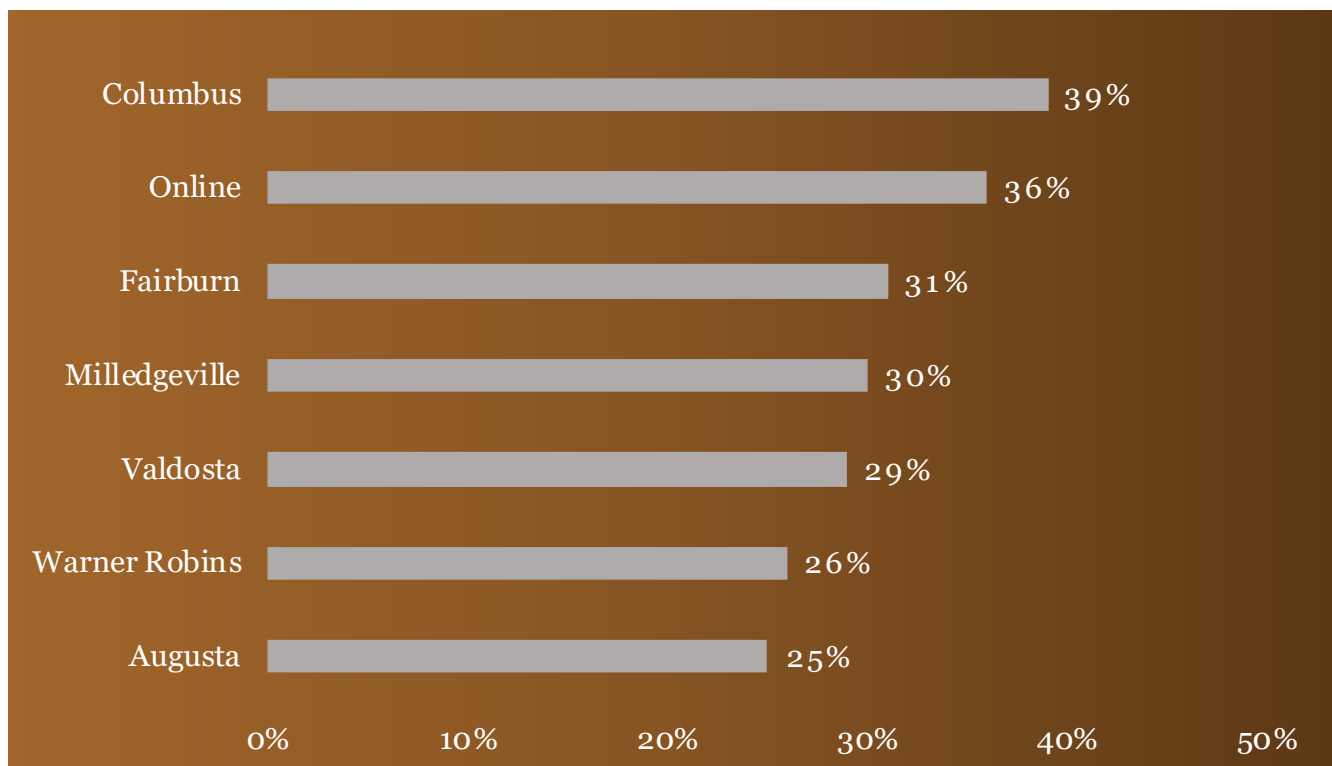
Transfer- Out Rate - Three Year (150%) First-Time, Full-Time Students



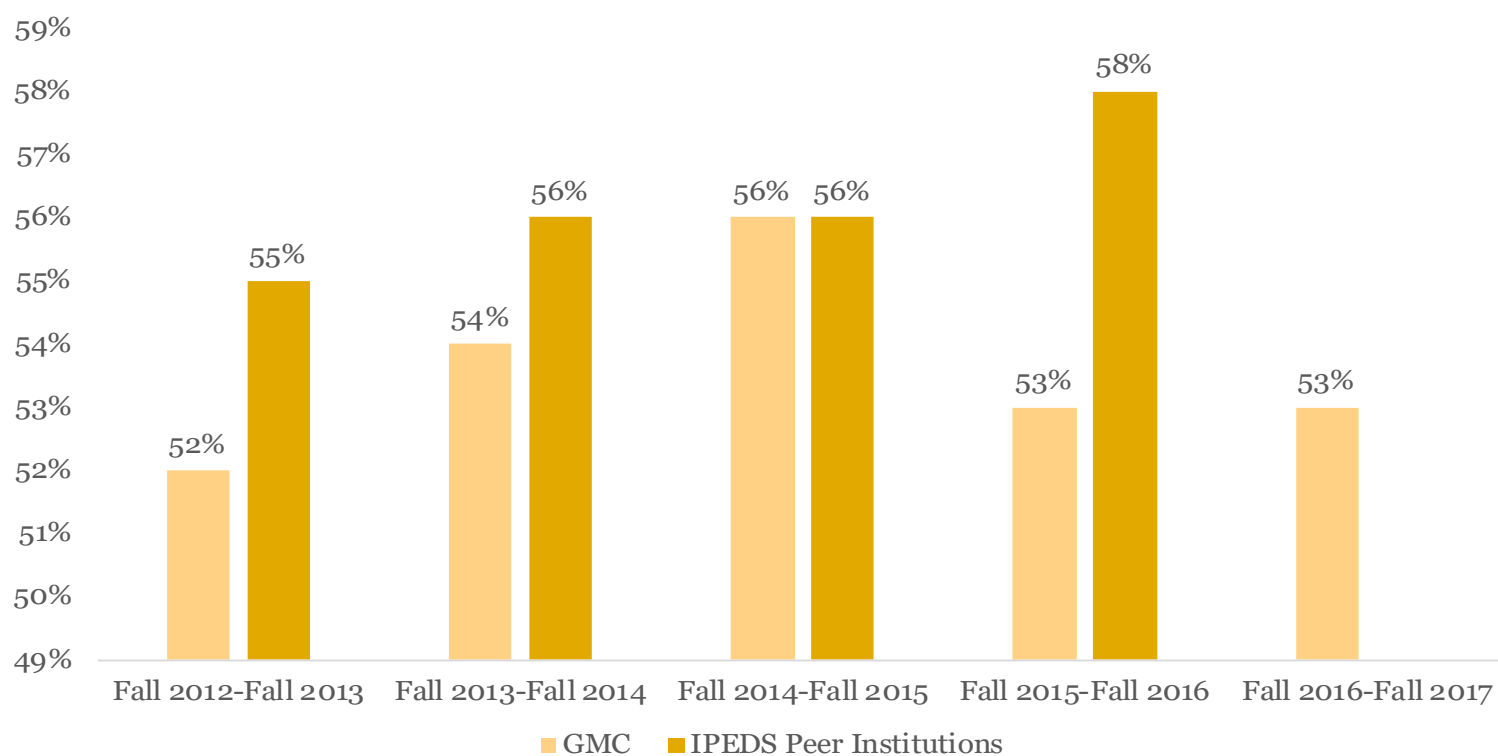
Three Year Graduation Rates by Campus (2014 Cohort)



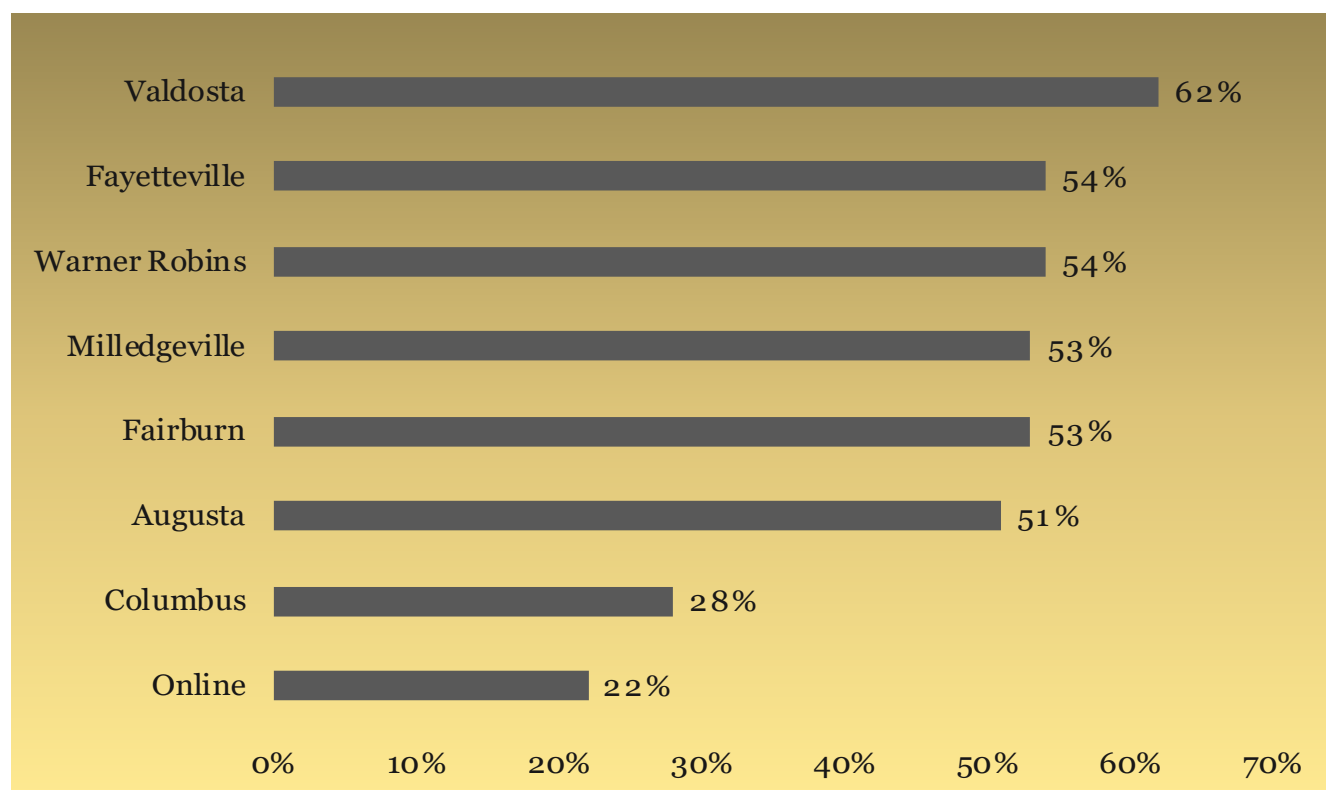
Three Year Transfer-Out Rates by Campus (2014 Cohort)



Retention Rate for First-Time, Full-Time Students

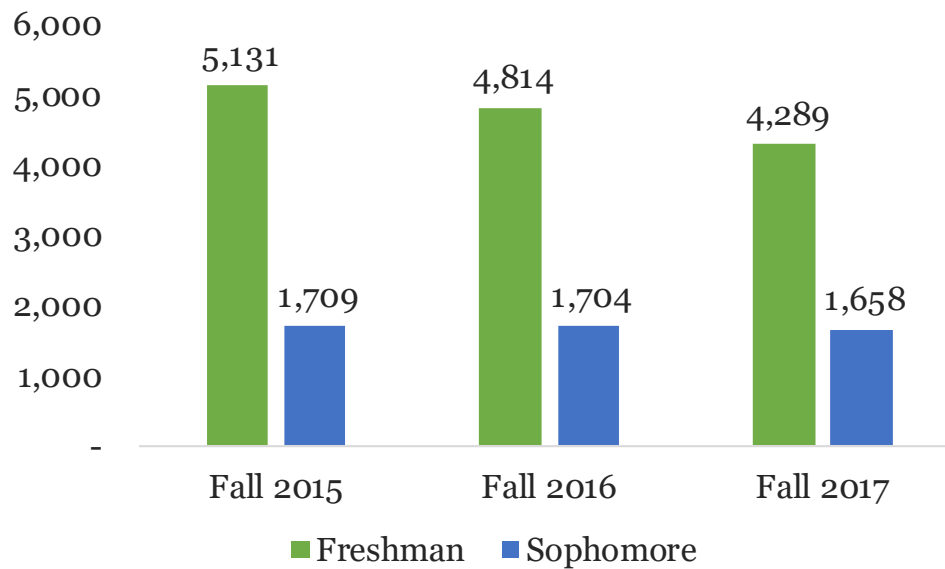


Retention Rates by Campus Fall 2016 - Fall 2017

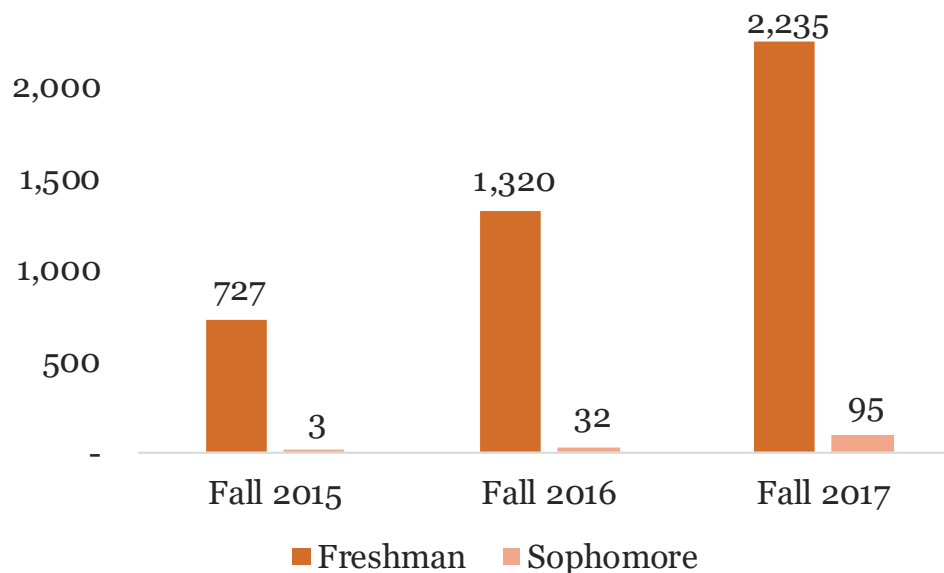

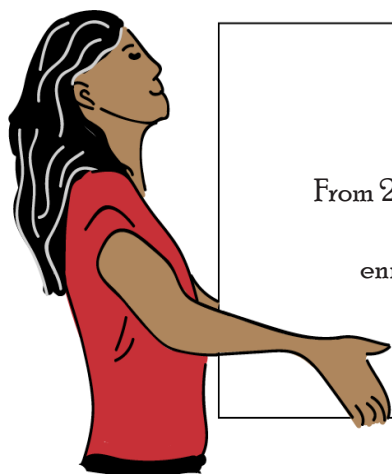

AA Studio Art

The Associate of Art (AA) degree in Studio Art prepares students for baccalaureate degree work in art at most four-year degree granting institutions through educating the student in the basic knowledge and skills of the field. The development of creativity, analysis, critical thinking, critique and portfolio presentation are integral to professional preparation in the workforce.

AS Computer Science

The Associate of Science (AS) in Computer Science program will educate students so that they have a command of basic programming and web design skills, enabling them to thoughtfully participate in the decisions of the marketplace and thereby contribute to the professions, communities, and organizations to which they belong.

AS Cyber Security

The Associate in Science (AS) in Cyber Security program will educate students so that they have a command of basic programming, networking, and information security skills, enabling them to thoughtfully participate in the decisions of the marketplace and thereby contribute to the professions, communities, and organizations to which they belong.

AS Kinesiology

The Associate in Science (AS) in Kinesiology program prepares students for baccalaureate degree work in Kinesiology/Exercise Science at most four-year institutions by preparing them in the basic knowledge of this field; such as anatomy & physiology, energy systems and bioenergetics, biomechanics, planes of motion, muscular contractions, exercise selection and testing, program design, injury identification and rehabilitation protocols and coach/athletic interactions which play a significant role in professional preparation.

BAS Supervision and Management

The Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) in Supervision and Management degree program is designed to prepare students for supervisory and management roles and positions within a variety of businesses and industries. The curriculum includes courses that will provide a solid understanding of supervision and management practices that will aid and develop the potential of our graduates to be successful in their business environment.

BAS Business Management

The Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) in Business Management degree program is designed to prepare students for leadership roles and management positions within a variety of businesses and industries. The curriculum includes courses that will provide a solid understanding of organizational leadership and management practices designed to aid and develop the potential of our graduates to be successful leaders in their business environment.

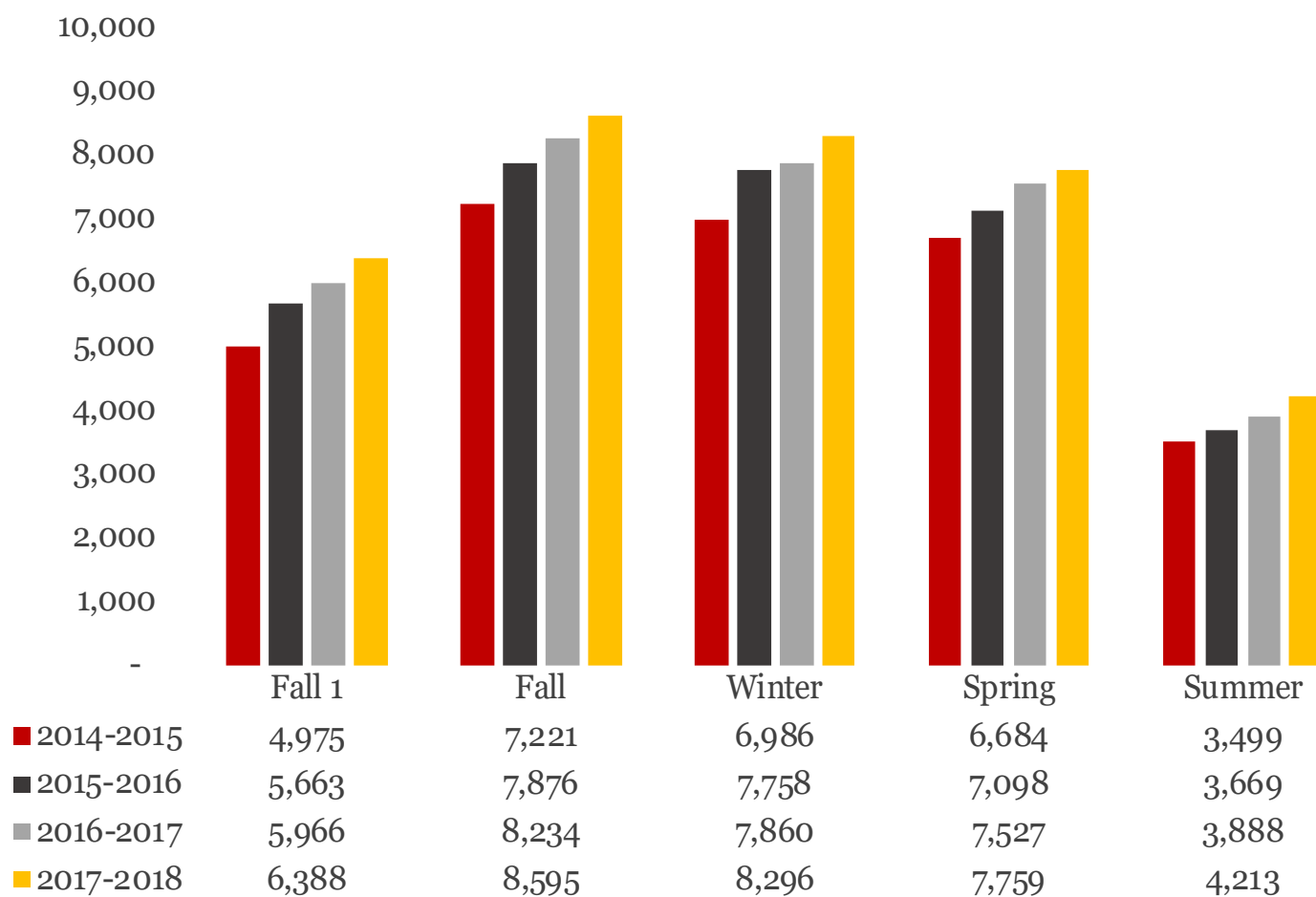
BAS Supply Chain Management and Logistics

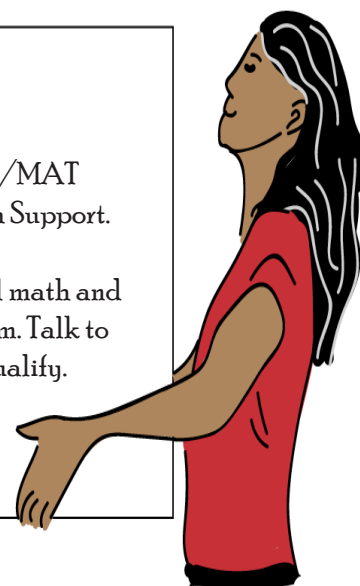

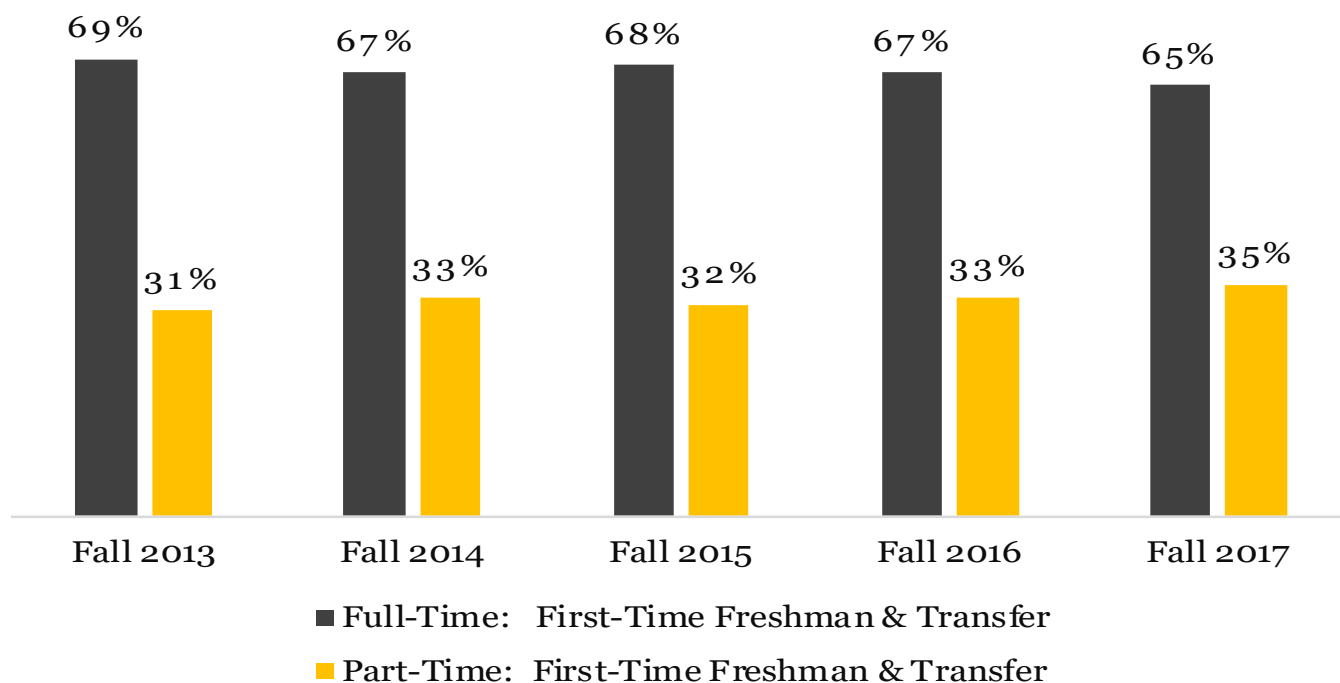

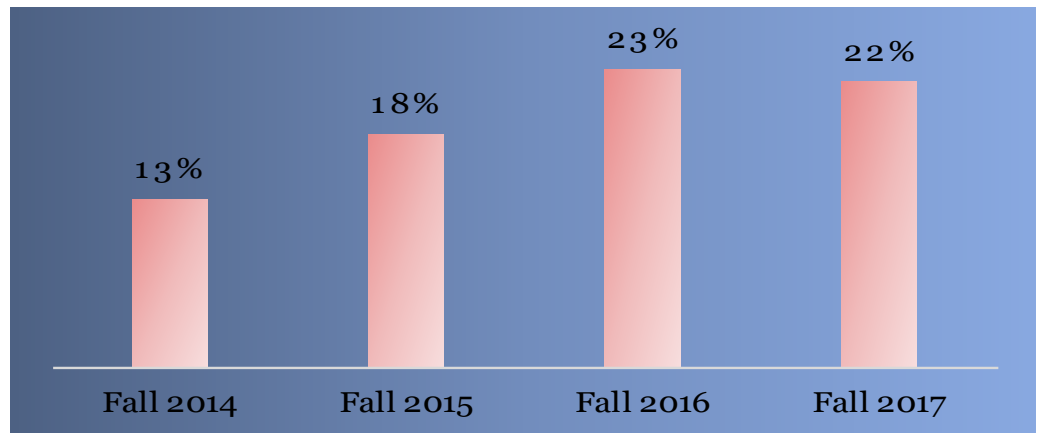

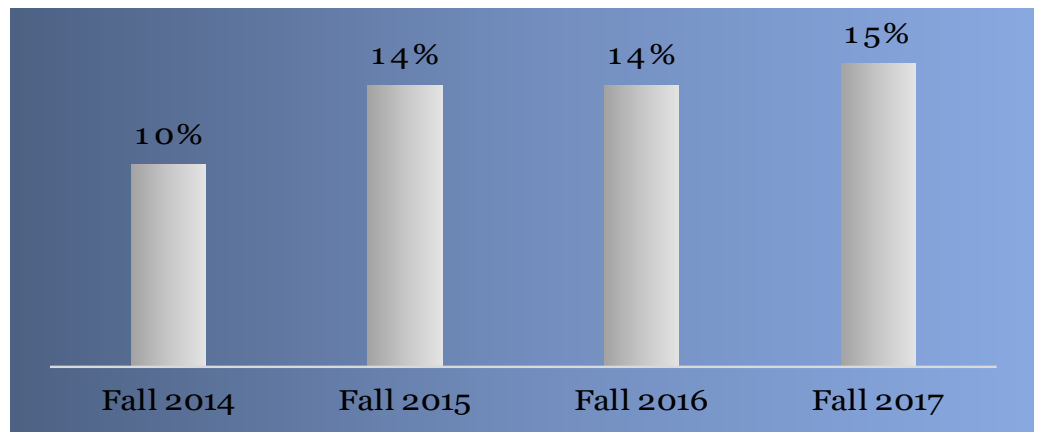

Enrollment by Course Format

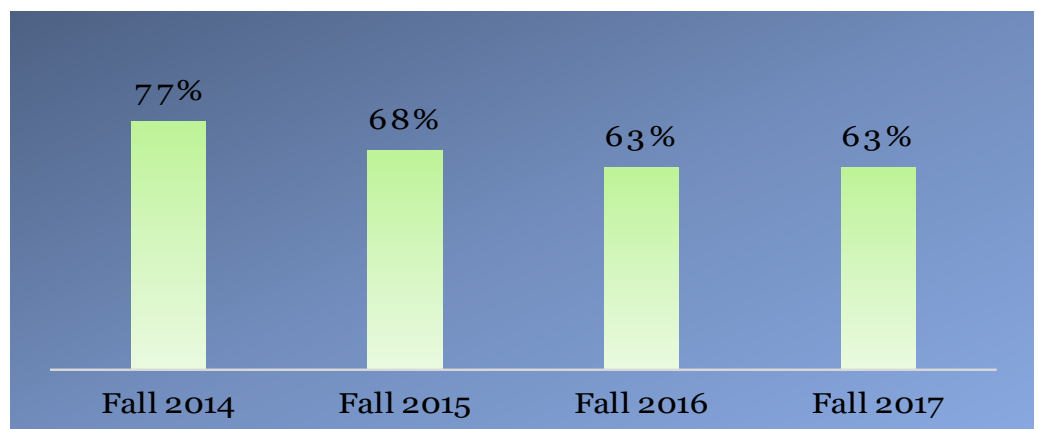

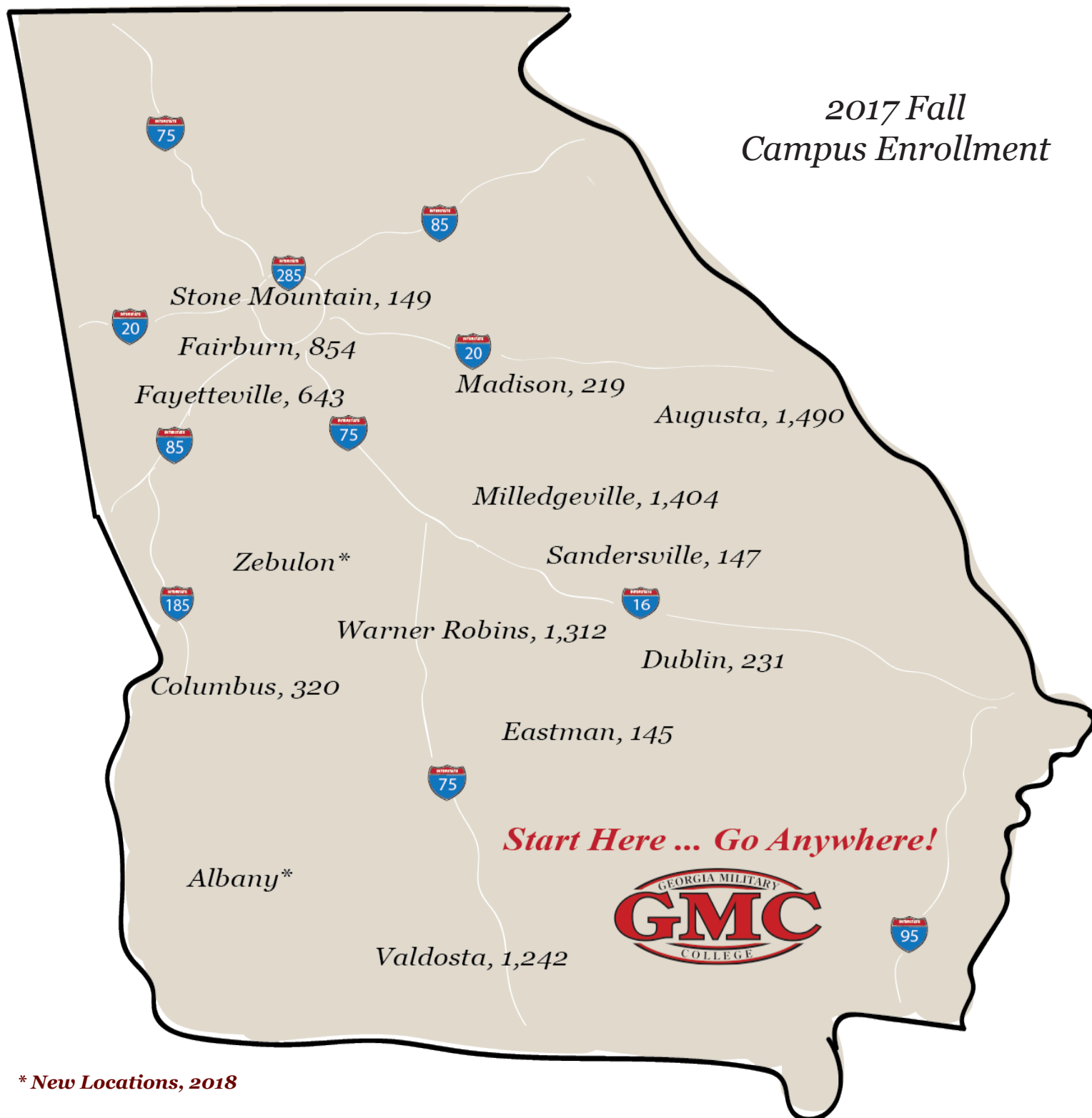
