Ethics Bowl teams debate ethical questions presented at the competition on a wide variety of issues. These include social, political and professional ethics, as

well as classroom ethics. Students are judged on their ability to provide a clear and systematic presentation of not only the team's viewpoint, but also of alternate viewpoints on the issue being discussed. "This broadens the students' ability to consider and understand the complexities of ethical issues," according to Ms. Shirley Siegel, one of the team's coaches.
