The Mercy Works program has been established within the Office of Campus Ministry to reflect and enhance our commitment to the Mercy tradition of service to society. Our goal is to connect the talents of GMC students with people in need in our wider community, as well as to offer students opportunities to reflect on their experience of service.

Through the Mercy Works program, Campus Ministry at GMC strives to be faithful to Catherine's legacy.

Current Mercy Work programs include:

Habitat for Humanity Mercy Works sponsors several Saturday workdays each year for Gwynedd-Mercy College students to get involved with the Montgomery County chapter of Habitat for Humanity. Groups will depart from Visitation at 8 am and return around 4 pm. HFH workdays are known for being fulfilling and rewarding experiences, therefore volunteer spots are in high demand. Manna on Main Street, Lansdale PA Manna on Main is a local organization that serves poor and hungry residents in the area. Mercy Works volunteers are needed monthly to prepare meals at Visitation House and to serve them at Manna.

Mercy Mentors Students from Gwynedd-Mercy College spend time with children and adolescents residing at St. Mary's Villa for Children and Families in Ambler, to develop mentoring relationships during the school year. Training is provided in the September, but new members are always welcome. Students gather with the children in a group setting on Mondays and Thursdays after dinner; mentors are welcome either day or both. Hunger & Homelessness Awareness Week This event in mid-November serves to raise awareness of the extent of homelessness, hunger, and poverty in our country.

Mercy 4 Justice Students and interested faculty/staff focus on a variety of justice issues, from Darfur to fair trade, environmental awareness and human trafficking.

GMC Holiday Outreach Students collect food and gifts for Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays for families who otherwise would not be able to celebrate the season. The Giving Tree, which encourages students, faculty and staff to provide gifts for participants in Mercy Neighborhood Ministries' programs in North Philadelphia, is located in St. Bernard's Lobby in late November; gifts must be returned in the first week of December.

Alternative Spring Break Each year, Mercy Works sponsors spring break service trips to various sites throughout the United States. In past years we have served in Arizona, Texas, and Ohio. **In 2009, 47 students traveled to sites in New Orleans LA, Savannah GA, Baltimore MD and the Bronx, NY.** Students were immersed in the life of a community and worked alongside its members in service. Participants also learned about the daily and long-term issues challenging the community, placing it in a position of need. Students paid only \$50 personally, but made a significant commitment to fund-raising. Applications for ASB 2010 will be available by early October, 2009.
