### **Tickets**

Mathis City auditorium's seating is limited, therefore graduates are limited to six tickets. If the graduate wishes to request additional tickets, please see Ms. House, Bldg. A, room 212. If extra tickets become available, you will be contacted.

### **Guest Seating**

Doors open to the public at 6:00pm. Guests should be seated by 6:50pm. The event begins promptly at 7:00pm. Steps, walkways, and reserved seating in the auditorium should not be blocked. If a row begins to fill, empty seats should be occupied to make room for other guest. Event staff may request empty seats be filled as needed, especially as the auditorium approaches full capacity.

Air horns and other noise makers are not permitted inside the auditorium. When celebrating your graduate, please be courteous and allow the next graduate's name to be heard.
