#### Course Book Pick-up / Drop-off

- In-Seat Courses Books for Quarter 2 in-seat courses can be picked up in the Augusta Campus Bookstore beginning on October 12, 2023. Student must be present to pick up books. Students are required to show course schedule and student ID in the bookstore to obtain textbooks.
- . Books cannot be marked with ink or highlighters.
- All books for in-seat courses must be returned to the bookstore by December 15, 2023. Any book not returned by the due date will be subject to a \$25 fee per book. Damaged, lost, or unreturned books will be subject to a \$100 fee per book.

#### Advising Center

- Hours are 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM Monday through Thursday and Friday from 8:00 AM to 12 PM.
- Students should complete advisement early and verify that all account holds have been removed before the start of registration.

#### WITHDRAWAL / DROP POLICY

- Drop/Add is available to all students Wednesday, October 18 Monday, October 23, 2023. If you withdraw after these dates, you will be charged for the full price of the class.
- Students are responsible for completion of all steps required to withdraw from a class. When students miss deadlines, policies apply that may penalize them. When students register for classes, they have entered into a contractual agreement and are obligated to pay Georgia Military College for any courses on that contract at the time of registration. After students have registered, they must complete a Change in Registration form to remove/ change that contract. After the Drop/Add period ends, students may only withdraw from class and are financially responsible for that class. Collection fees may be applied to all outstanding balances.

#### BOOKSTORE VOUCHERS

- Bookstore vouchers for both in-seat and online classes will be available around October 12.
- Vouchers must be used by October 19, 2023. Students should check their portal and show their statement for utilization.

#### **IDENTIFICATION BADGES**

- Please remember that ID badges must be worn and visible at ALL times while the student is on the GMC-Augusta campus.
- Student IDs are required to attend classes as well as receive service in all departments.
- Students are allowed one temporary badge per term; after that there is a fee of \$5 for any additional temporary ID badges.
- There is a \$25 fee for replacement of lost student IDs.

#### PARKING PERMITS & VEHICLE PASSES

- Students are required to have a Georgia Military College Parking Permit displayed at all times. If you do not have one, they may be obtained at the front desk.
- Student parking is located in between the main building, Brenau building, and the Science and Technology building. There is extra parking on the side of Brenau and an over-flow parking lot located across the street.

#### GRADUATION

- Students may complete degree requirements during any term of the academic year.
- Students finishing degree requirements during Quarter 2 must complete a graduation application package during Quarter 1. See your Graduation Coach in Room 151 for details.
- Regardless of the term in which the degree is completed, all students are eligible and encouraged to participate in the official graduation ceremony in the Spring of each year.
- The 2024 graduation will be held in May. Additional details will be posted on campus and emailed to students in the months leading up to the ceremony.
- Please be sure to list an active personal email address on the graduation application to ensure you receive this important information.
- There is no application fee for graduation.
- Planning your next step after graduation? See the back page of this publication for a list of Georgia Military College's Articulation Agreements with four-year institutions; many with guaranteed admission for GMC graduates.

#### FINANCIAL AID SOURCES

#### Military Tuition Assistance (TA)

- Military TA must be requested 7 days before the term starts.
- Students receiving military tuition assistance should contact Mrs. Marilyn Miller, Fort Gordon Coordinator, at (706) 993-1112.

#### ❖ VA Benefits

- A Certificate of Eligibility from the VA Regional Office and a Request for Certification of VA Benefits form must be completed; otherwise the student is responsible for all tuition charges.
- > Your Graduation Coach can assist with Veteran's benefits processing.

#### ❖ Pell Grant

- Any student entering college may apply for the Federal Pell Grant. Awards are based on a determination of need by the Federal Department of Education, taking into account the financial status of the student and parent.
- To apply for Pell, please complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at StudentAid.gov.
- > Pell Grant may be used in addition to other financial aid.
- > All students are encouraged to apply for the Pell Grant to assist with tuition & fees.
- Students are responsible for providing any verification documentation requested by their Graduation Coach.

#### HOPE Scholarship

- The HOPE Scholarship is available to all Georgia residents who meet the criteria set by the state.
- Second Chance HOPE is available to Georgia residents who meet the state's qualifying criteria.
- Please contact the Advising Center for information regarding the specific rules and policies for both HOPE and Second Chance HOPE.

#### ❖ Georgia Tuition Equalization Grant (GTEG)

- The GTEG program provides non-repayable grants to eligible Georgia residents who enroll on a full-time basis at Georgia Military College.
- To be considered full-time, a student must be registered for 12 or more credit hours and actively attending class. Attendance is monitored to verify eligibility.
- ➤ GTEG eligible students can receive payment for the summer term and three (3) quarters during the regular award year (Quarters 1-4). Please see your Graduation Coach for further information
- State grant regulations and award amounts are subject to change during an award year.

#### ❖ Dual Enrollment (DE)

- ➤ The Dual Enrollment Program provides for participation in Dual Credit Enrollment for Eligible High School and Home Schooled students.
- These students earn postsecondary credit hours and simultaneously meet their high school graduation or Home Study completion requirements as Dual Credit Enrollment students.
- Interested students should complete the Dual Enrollment Funding Application online at GAFutures.org.
- Dual Enrollment students are only allowed two (2) voluntary, or involuntary, withdrawals. Once a student has two withdrawals they will be ineligible to continue participating in the program.

#### ❖ Student Loans

Federal guaranteed student loans are available. See your Graduation Coach for information and appropriate forms.

### FINANCIAL AID SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS (SAP) STANDARDS

- A student will be expected to achieve certain minimum progress toward the successful academic completion of course requirements for a degree.
- Progress toward the degree is measured both quantitatively and qualitatively. There is also a maximum allowable time frame for completion of the degree.
- Failing to meet these criteria may result in the termination of Financial Aid.
- At GMC, standards for maintaining such progress are as follows:

#### **>** QUALITATIVE STANDARD:

A student must maintain a good cumulative GPA based on the number of hours attempted.

#### **▶** QUANTITATIVE STANDARD:

A student must maintain a satisfactory progress rate by successfully completing two-thirds (67%) of all credit hours attempted at GMC.

A student who fails to maintain their SAP will be placed on either Academic Warning or Academic Suspension as described below:

#### ➤ ACADEMIC WARNING:

A student is placed on Academic Warning when the cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) at the end of any quarter falls below the standards of satisfactory progress, or the GPA is 1.50 or less regardless of the overall GPA.

#### ACADEMIC SUSPENSION:

A student must maintain good academic standing. Failure to do so results in Academic Suspension.

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#### REVERSE TRANSFER INITIATIVE (RTI)

#### What is Reverse Transfer?

- Reverse Transfer is a process that makes it possible for students to finish earning their Associate Degree while continuing to work on their Bachelor's Degree.
- Students who have earned at least 23 credit hours with GMC and have transferred to a four-year institution without an Associate Degree may "reverse transfer" credits earned at their four-year institution to complete their Associate Degree with GMC.

#### Why is an Associate Degree Important?

- An Associate Degree is an important marketable achievement that is valued by employers, transfer institutions, and professional institutions.
- It can help provide job opportunities for you while completing your Bachelor's Degree.
- It shows prospective employers and post-graduate institutions you are able to stay motivated in completing your goals.

#### Why Should I Be Interested in Reverse Transfer?

- Most colleges look at students having Associate Degrees as favorable.
- If you later decide to transfer to a different four-year college, it will be easier to do so with an Associate Degree
- It can provide additional opportunities with employers, in professional organizations, and in the community.
- You earn something that cannot be taken away from you.

#### ❖ How Do I Complete the Reverse Transfer Process?

- Ask your Graduation Coach for the Reverse Transfer application, complete it, and return it to them.
- We will contact you periodically to send in your transcripts from your current college.
- When you have earned the necessary credits to complete your GMC degree your Associate Degree will be awarded and your diploma mailed to you.

#### LIBRARY

- Georgia Military College provides full library assistance, both in person with our campus library staff and through the library's Ask a Librarian chat. They can help with everything: using library resources, citations, assistance with technology, etc.
- GMC's eLibrary includes more than 125 databases and collections containing millions of sources, books, and journals that are available to our students whereever they are whenever they need them;.
- Physical sources are available to students from our main library in Milledgeville through inter-library loan.
- The library is also the hub for our student printing service, Bulldog Printing. Students get \$30 a term in printing credit to print whatever they need. It is a four-term rolling balance, so what you don't use in one term will carry over to the next.

# ARTICULATION AGREEAS AGREEMENTS

#### What is an Articulation Agreement?

An articulation agreement is a formal partnership between two academic institutions to follow an agreed upon process to provide a formalized pathway for student transfer. GMC currently has 52 articulation agreements.

#### What do GMC's Articulation Agreements mean for you?

GMC's articulation agreements mean that most, if not all, of the coursework you take at GMC is guaranteed to transfer to those four-year institutions that GMC has agreements with. Some even include guaranteed admission to the institution, though some programs of study may have additional admission requirements.
